This is **one example** of a 4-year course plan that satisfies the requirements for a healthcare and business major. This is just one example, there are many possible variations. This example includes an optional **Risk Management concentration** and strives for a 7-semester graduation. This schedule could also be easily modified to study abroad for an entire semester and graduate in the usual 8 semesters.
